Other ideas aired: IDoR videos (CHOP), US videos.

3/IDoR

Update should be a part of annual WFPI report
 COMMUNICATIONS
 A schedule of on-line meetings needs to be organized

AD: explained IDOR-WFPI-Radiopaedia partnership in more detail (see previous EXCOM minutes and slides on Radiopaedia.org reach compared to other organizations in Annual Report). Should lead to a surge in website traffic, need the site looking fresh and good. Details to be fixed soon: type of cases (probably general radiologists), calls to all regions for contributions.

Catherine Owens suggested running it by the IDoR organizing committee.

Action

DB to run WFPI-Radiopaedia initiative by the IDoR organizing committee [presumably no "authorization" needed as multiple initiatives are being encouraged/will hopefully roll out – not centralized. So just for information's sake].

4/ Discussion with guests from Brazil and Spain on their increased involvement with WFPI

SERPE: looking for participation via IDoR initiatives. Work done in Catalan, can be translated.

BRAZIL: Henrique Lederman outlined MOOC online work (webinars) for teaching, partnering with Google for general public access and multi-lingual translation. WFPI can disseminate access. Job market limited for pediatric radiologists in Brazil so fellowships combined peds/mammo or peds/adult.

NIGERIA: Omolola Atalabi explained that other specialities getting saturated – peds may garner more interest. For IDoR, a speaker sought to visit Nigeria (would be funded). Need to match radiologists with places that would like to receive them, get resources from industry.

5/ Miscellaneous points

VD: stated would like to see priorities set. Too much going on.

WL: much better organized than before, monthly EXCOM helped considerably

AD: These "open" meetings (expose what goes on elsewhere) and discussions on initiatives such as IDoR (brainstorming) can give the impression of a mass of ideas with no clear follow through.

But with regard to WFPI's day in, day out work: watch the presentation of the Annual Report this afternoon

- ⇒ Shows all the work done on narrowing down the education mandate (priorities: website, video library, using social media to teach and draw people onto our site/library). Onsite teaching ALWAYS welcomed but must be funded from elsewhere.
- ⇒ Outreach: EXCOM did just narrow it down by re-affirming "bolt on" and defining when and how bolt on takes place. This takes big pressure off the outreach team re which projects/organizations to partner with and where its role lies. Much narrower than when WFPI set out. Priorities: telereading, TB, US in lower resource settings.
